

## Police order 5,594 vehicles to turn back at roadblocks

KUALA LUMPUR: A total of \$,594 vehicles were ordered to turn back by the authorities manning roadblocks nationwide on the eve of Hari Raya Aidiladha.

This, said police, marked a significant increase from the 4,666 vehicles ordered to turn back on Sunday.

Senior Assistant Commissioner
M.V. Srikumar Nair, who is with
Bukit Aman's Internal Security
and Public Order Department,
said 33S compounds were issued
at the roadblocks over failure to
adhere to the standard operating
procedures of the Movement
Control Order.
